BIRTHPLACE MUSEUM GETS SET TO GROW WITH NEW EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR

LILY CRANE, COLBY COLLEGE

"For my internship I researched Quakerism, values and the influence of the Quaker religion on Susan B. Anthony's life.

Being raised by a Quaker father and surrounded, especially during childhood, by Quaker values had an impact on Susan's political ideas, especially those concerning the rights of women. My project resulted in a paper comparing several of Susan's major political views with the views common to Quakers. The summer internship was a great experience!"

While at the museum this summer, Gale coordinated the Birthplace Museum's outreach to the Leavenworth, KS, area. She worked with the Legler Barn Museum in Lenexa, where the Susan B. Anthony quilt is on display as a living exhibit, as volunteers hand sew the batting and backing to the cover that was made by the Quilting Guild in the Berkshires.

Gale also made connections for the Susan B. Anthony historical performer, Jeanne Gehret, to visit historical associations, schools and museums to spread the Susan's message about Temperance, Abolition, Suffrage and her Opposition to Restellism, as Kansas celebrates its 100th anniversary of suffrage. Upon completing her internship, Gale created a display about the quilt at the Legler Barn Museum.

MIRIAM MANDA, WESLEYAN UNIVERSITY

Miriam just finished an internship at The Presidio of San Francisco. A recent Wesleyan University graduate, Miriam will work on an archeological dig where Susan's great, grandfather Joshua Read's farm once was. She will do research on the Read family and the cultural dynamic of Lucy and Daniel's marriage in respect to the religion and social norms of the time.

Miriam admires Susan's strength and perseverance, and has seen these qualities in her own mother, who is Sudanese and studied pharmacy in Russia. Miriam was born in Zambia and lived in South Africa, where she attended grade school in a predominately white, private school. She then moved to Philadelphia with her parents and brother.

MAGIC AT THE MUSEUM

Performances by Old Sturbridge Village's Robert Olsen kicked off the town of Adams' Susan B. Anthony Days in July. Portraying Mr. E.A. Davis, a magician from the 1870s who traveled the country entertaining families in private homes, Olsen wowed children and adults.

The event was funded in part by a grant from the Northern Berkshire Cultural Council, a local agency which is supported by the Massachusetts Cultural Council, a state agency.

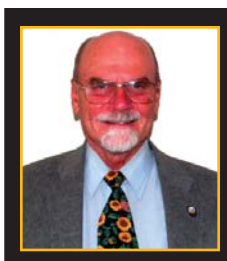

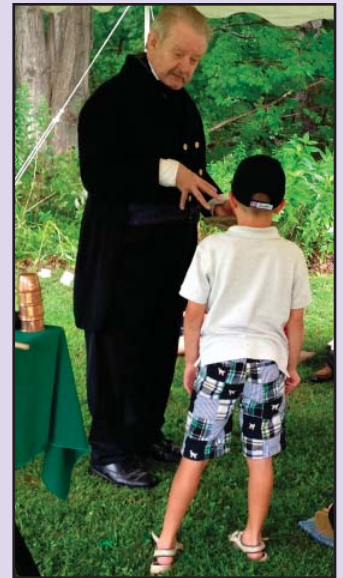


SUZANNE SCHNITTMAN

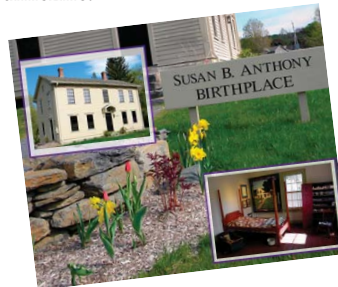

ABOUT THE SUSAN B. ANTHONY BIRTHPLACE MUSEUM

In 2006 Birthplace Museum founders took on the task of restoring the house, which had been vacant for 11 years and formally privately owned. The SBA Birthplace Museum opened in the spring of 2010.

This rural, Federal-style home, now listed in the National Register, contains a portrait gallery, legacy room, and birthing room — depicting family and work life in the early 1800s— as well as authentic period pieces, ephemera, and a detailed timeline.
